## Objectives

- ❖ Increased FP budget at district level
- ❖ Improved service quality and access to LAPM
- ❖ Conducive public policy to support FP program

**AFP Indonesia – Dini Haryati and Inne Silviane**

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- Conducive FP policy trends in five operational districts
- FP budget 2014 increased 11-94% in four operational districts
- FP at work site in 35 companies initiated in Pontianak
- 270 villages in Bandung allocate 4 – 8 millions IDR for FP activities

## Progress Update



- 1 Advocate policymakers to allocate village budget for family planning
- 2 Build policymakers awareness to prioritize family planning program
- 3 AFP Diffusion through KB Kencana national program

## 2014 Work in Progress

- **Uncertified and lack of skilled midwives in providing IUD and implant services and counselling for LAPM**
  - There are only 36,000 trained midwives from the total amount of 200,000 midwives (IDHS, 2012)
  - Central Government only allocates CTU trainings for 15 midwives per year per district
- **Education on contraceptive benefits and life-stage appropriate methods**
  - Less than a half women have correct knowledge about the use and durations of LAPMs (ICMM, 2014)
  - BkkbN at the district level only allocates 0,04% - 0,2% of their annual budget for FP program (BkkbN, 2013)

## **Challenges**

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## ■ **Implementation of JKN**

- Confusion regarding whether FP services is part of capitation or re-imbursement scheme, how midwives get compensated, and how FP services can be accessible to communities in remote areas is rife

## ■ **Mobile vs Static Services**

- LAPM achievement fluctuated based on momentum

## ■ **Election Year**

- FP programs are commonly not prioritized during 2014, due to Presidential and Legislative Election
