New Geographies and Partnerships

- Facilitated AFP SMART sessions for eight new districts FP Advocacy Working Groups
- Working with Engender Health, at national level and Faith to Action Network, World Vision, Aids Information Centre, Brick by Brick , Flama, FHI360/Obulamu project, etc. on the AFP SMART approach and integration of FP in their programming
- Shared AFP district advocacy approach in a MoH workshop to develop a harmonised FP CIP district dissemination and implementation plan
- Working with PATH and other partners to scale up Sayana Press® in the country, and also working with IPPF to hold a meeting of programmers from selected countries in Africa to accelerate the commitment for the Sayana Press® meeting in Senegal
- Working with PMA2020 country team to strengthen synergy between researchers and advocates – research and advocacy

Major Advocacy Wins

National

FP indicators included in the Uganda GFF Program Appraisal Document (PAD) and Parliament approves the GFF investment case

Subnational

Twenty three (23) district FP Advocacy Working Groups formed and a number of them register quick wins. For instance:

- Dokolo district dedicates 2 hours weekly to provide adolescents with FP/SRH services
- Rakai, Kabale and Kanungu have developed district FP CIPs
- 28 out of 33 AFP targeted districts have mainstreamed FP in their sector plans

Quick Win to Impact

Uganda government signs MOU for Alternative Distribution Strategy (ADS) for Family Planning (FP) commodities and supplies

- MoH/UNFPA pay UHMG arrears for storage and handling services
- UHMG fully stocked with FP commodities through the years
- Continued access to contraceptives by non governmental agencies and their clients

Impact

- **Increased CPR from 30% in 2011 to 39% in 2016**
- **Reduction in unmet need from 34% in 2011 to 28% in 2016**

Resources and opportunities to advance and sustain FP Advocacy

- Galvanizing political will and commitment for FP at all levels
- Dissemination of FP related policies country wide
- Formation of FP WGs in the rest of the country
- Strategies for provision of FP services and information to adolescents
- The Global Gag Rule likely to reduce donor funding for FP thus the increased need to focus on amplifying the GOU's investment in FP
