

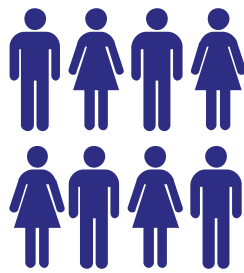

What is Going Well?



- District level engagement and responsiveness towards FP;
- **Broadened and collective action (govt/partners) on tracking, data gathering (eLMIS)**
- Increased partner coordination in FP *outreach approaches* eg Service Delivery Organizations (SDOs) and the Green Star campaign; SDOs and HLIs SRH/FP services; engaging religious leaders

What is **not** going well?

- Procurement Regulations Amendment
multiple interests; Govt bias against broad stakeholders participation esp CSOs;

Next Steps

- ✓ Advocacy for Accountability at Local Government Authorities on ILS & eLMIS;
- ✓ Building *champions / eminent persons* at national level to sustain FP advocacy as development agenda;
- ✓ Developing consistent FP language for inclusion in the HSSP IV, MKUKUTA III, FYDP, ---(from 2016)
