SOCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY



Social Accountability

Social accountability is a broad category that refers to activities where communities and citizens hold officials responsible for meeting their obligations - this can often include increasing citizen's voices and shifting power relationships.

Social audits and **social monitoring** are different methodologies/tools for social accountability.



PUBLIC POLICY



Public Policy

Public policy can be generally defined as a system of laws, regulatory measures, courses of action, and funding priorities concerning a given topic promoted by a governmental entity and/or its citizens.



SOCIAL PARTICIPATION



Social Participation/Political Participation

- It is a right of individuals and organizations
- Impacts policies, programs, and courses of action
- Development, execution, and evaluation



SOCIAL MONITORING



Social Monitoring

- Citizen initiative
- Confirms that objectives are achieved
 - Monitors use of public funds
 - Changes and improves programs



ADVOCACY



<u>Advocacy</u>

Targeted action for change

A sequence of actions that combines elements of planning, persuasion, and strategy, directed at modifying the status quo and the public policies that impact a specific population.

Direct advocacy

Direct engagement with decisionmakers to encourage and influence the modification or creation of public policy with a focus on redistribution and/or social justice.

Citizen action advocacy/Citizen-centered advocacy

Empower communities to engage in direct advocacy and active citizenship/political participation.

ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP




Active Citizenship

Manifests at an individual level, as participation, responsibility, solidarity and cooperation within the public sphere; and publicly demands for transparent government fiscal audits and accountability.





Quick Win: The Ministry of Health in three states made 13 health centers available for social monitoring

Colombia: Monitoring youth friendly services

- Achieved a political change: youth friendly services were adopted and incorporated in the Rionegro municipality
- Sustainability of youth friendly services





Fieldwork

3 weeks, 371 adolescents interviewed, 39 actors, 13 health centers

Colombia: Social Monitoring of Youth-friendly Health Services


• Young people led the advocacy efforts, designing the social monitoring instruments and conducted interviews and visits to 4 health service delivery centers

Results were presented to the Secretary of Health (Audit Report)






Data processing and analysis

Elaborating report that will lead to results

Adolescent services are positively scored No significant difference between "youthfriendly" and regular services The variety of contraceptve methods depends entirely on the training of health provider Unawareness of contraceptive services to adolescents





Present, discuss, and analyze the findings with the relevant authorities

Outcomes:

- Social monitoring is recognized as an accurate tool
- Health care providers will be trained on modern contraceptive methods
- Contraceptive services for adolescents will be promoted locally
- Increased analysis of the relevance of youth-friendly services



Dominican Republic: social monitoring experiences

- **Systematizing de Social Audit process**
- Presentation of results to the Ministry of Health's authorities and civil society
- Follow-up on the actions taken on recomendations made based on the social audit findings



Impact on political advocacy



In 2017, the National and Subnational Ministries of Health:

- Will integrate the recommendations into their anual SRH workplan
- Approved ongoing social monitoring activities co-financed by Mexfam
