









#### Win 1

## Bangladesh approves a study to introduce DMPA-SC

MSB adopted strategic direction in consultation with Advocacy Advisory group to raise the issue of DMPA-SC

- Collaborate with key stakeholders like UNFPA, government and FP experts
- Formal and informal dialogues with NTC with evidence based messages
- Finally able to get the approval from National Technical Committee

## DMPA-SC will contribute to:

- reduce unmet need of contraceptives from 12% to 6% by 2022;
- reduce discontinuation rate to 20% by 2021.
- reduce drop out rate specially in hard to reach areas as there is poor communication and limited service providers

## Opportunity from other donors

- UNFPA in collaboration with MSB and other organizations took initiatives to roll out DMPA-SC in Urban area
- DFID offered financial supports to introduce DMPA-SC through MSB clinics
- In February, a ToT was accomplished on DMPA-SC

- The study will cover:
- Rural and hard to reach areas
- Both self and provider administered
- Women from Poor and middle/upper class
- Time frame:
- One year from start time

# Win 2 Increasing FP access to young people through PPFP

Tri-party MoU signed among DGFP, Private Medical College & hospitals, and MSB to increase access of family planning services in urban areas for the youth and women in Bangladesh.



#### Factors to drive:

- Per year 70,000 number of clients visits for gynae and related issues to these medical colleges and hospitals and around 1500 students studding here
- Besides, privately provided health care is significant in reaching the general population as 64% of health service expenditure are generated by the people
- Private facility is the most commonly used in urban for delivery (65%) services

#### **Expected Impact**

- At least 2,000 youth will get access to FP services
- 30,000 of women from urban areas will get access to FP services

#### Win 3

Task-sharing

Present Policy Environment:

Nurses are not allowed to provide FP services

#### **Our Win:**

Bangladesh Nursing and Midwifery council includes practical hands on skills in their course curriculum

#### **Expected Impact**

- Contribute to build competency of 16000 students of Nursing council to provide FP services
- Besides, all together one lac nurses and midwives will be allowed to provide FP services
- Improve access to FP services

#### Win 4

## Government initiatives to build competency of the service providers on IUD

- Directorate General of Family Planning approved a revised IUD training curriculum in April,2018
- The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare approved a training plan with USD 33,800 to implement the plan



#### **Expected Impact**

- By June 2019 DGFP will provide ToT to 120 service providers and 5000 Family welfare visitors will be trained by 2020
- Contribute in popularizing IUD method

#### Diffusion/Collaboration

Facilitated AFP SMART workshop with youth leaders and they are applying AFP SMART approach to carry out their advocacy







## **Priority Issues**

Resources allocation for strengthening the capacity of AYFS

Education Ministry approves a curriculum by including comprehensive Life skillbased Education (LSBE) for the adolescents

Resources allocation for campaign to generate demand family planning information and services

Government will allocate resources to establish and to make functional adolescent & youth friendly service corners including urban area (FWVTI/district hospital/ Medical college/ GoB community center/city corporation

### Resource Mobilization

- In September 2018, 102
   Union Councils under Barisal and Pirojpur district allocated USD 56800
- Under Bagerhat district among the 68 unions, 58 union councils allocated resources of USD 70314.25 and revised their annual development plan.



## Sustainability

- District Working Group started ground work to formalize their platform
- Union councils included a clause in annual development plan to continue investment for FP
- Advocacy working group planning to promote for replicating the practice of resource mobilization

The national Advocacy advisory group will contribute to change the policies for FP program
