Major advocacy wins (national)



1. Engaging the Central Government

- 1. DRC Government Commitment to Family planning (Addis Ababa, 2013);
- 2. Elaboration of the FP National Strategic Plan (2014-2020)

2. Mobilizing others

- Increasing donor contributions
- 2. Mobilizing new actors (confessional organizations, civil society organizations...)
- 3. Attracting new donors for FP (foundations, bilateral, private sector...)

3. And celebrating progress...

- Dramatic increase in Modern Contraceptive Prevalence in the DRC - (from 8.0% (DHS, 2013-14) to 18% (MICS, 2018)
- 2. FP has become legal in the DRC (Public Health Law voted in 2018 with favorable provisions to FP): FP is allowed for all persons of childbearing age (including adolescents)
- 3. Increased coverage of FP services
- 4. Creation of the line "Contraceptive purchases" within the national and provincial budget nomenclature

Major advocacy wins (provincial)



1. Stand-alone CTMP creation already on day one (scaling up of the National framework)


2. Self-organization

- Definition of advocacy objectives and specific work plans by each province
- Identification of new FP actors
- Mobilization of local resources
- Self-assessment and information sharing

3. Impact

- Self-management of activities (meetings in the provinces, participation in annual meetings in Kinshasa, participation in FP conferences): Ex Province South and North Kivu
- Reduction of external contributions (AFP) dedicated to the CTMP functioning
- Increased coverage of FP services

Graduation plans



All 14 CTMPs are in the process of graduating.

- Graduation began on the same day they were createdwith cofinancing from AFP
- Key activities prior to implementation
 - Recent FP projects existing in the province
 - Negotiation with project donors and implementing organizations to support the creation of the CTMP
 - Mobilization of financial resources
- 3. Creation and graduation

Sustainability monitoring

1. Opportunities:

- Annual meetings of provincial CTMPs
- Sharing of self-assessment results of CTMPs
- Sharing flash infos on advocacy wins and important events

2. Challenges to overcome:



OTHER CHANGES

- Organization of the 4th National FP Conference
 - 1. Celebration of the surprising increase in DRC national contraceptive prevalence (increase of 2.5 percentage points per year)
 - 2. Renewal of the DRC's commitment to PF (Speech by the President of the DRC, 4th National Conference of PF) Dec. 2019
 - 3. Integration of DMPA SC in the community offer and promotion of self-injection DMPA SC
