# **Kenya Advocacy Wins**

Kenya's Ministry of Health drafts DMPA-SC Implementation Plan for Pharmacists and Pharmaceutical Technologists and develops a National Training Package

Makueni County sustains family planning financing through a law that provides for 1.5% of the annual health budget to Family planning and reproductive health

Ministry of Education Homabay County issues a circular directing head- teachers to collect, record and report data on teenage pregnancy using a multi-sectoral tool. Three other counties;- Kwale, Migori and Busia are in the process of taking similar actions

### **From Advocacy Win to Impact** Kwale County Two –Fold Contraceptive Increase among Adolescents

County First Lady as a Champion of FP Catalyzed a multisectoral initiative to address the high burden of teen pregnancy Development of county multistakeholder **Teenage Pregnancy Action Plan** to provide contraception information & Services Implementation of the Action Plan led to linking of 100 schools with high burden of teenage pregnancy to 20 health facilities for SRH information and contraception services Between Jan 2017-Dec 2019, Kwale County records a **Two Fold** (86%) increase in contraceptive uptake among young people aged 10-19 years.

### **From Advocacy Win to Impact** Media Spurs Action on Stock-Outs in Migori County

AFP Jhpiego **Media Orientation and Mentorship** on Family Planning Reporting Journalist from Milambo FM in Migori County produced in-depth, compelling stories on commodity stock-outs Milambo FM holds interactive segments with citizens and Government officials to foster accountability Migori County redistributes family planning commodities improving method mix in seven facilities affected by stock-outs.

**5.**Platforms of critical mass of advocates and champions to sustain FP advocacy


